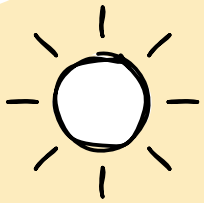

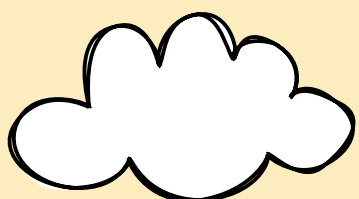


Streamline decision-making for better business outcomes.

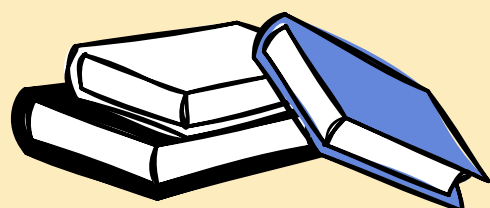


DEVELOP DECISION-MAKING SKILLS

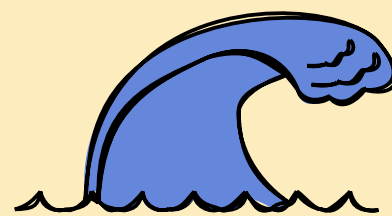
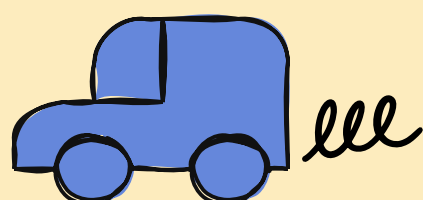
IMPLEMENT DEADLINES FOR DECISIONS

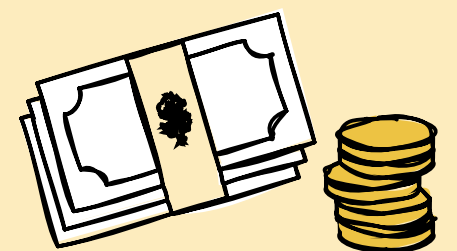


FOSTER A DECISION-MAKING CULTURE
